THE TRIPLE BOTTOM LINE FOR TORONTO AND CANADA

Understanding Toronto and Canada's goals is the first step in determining the impacts of a mega-event like the Olympic Games or World Expos.



Social

Rebranding

Canada's bilingual and multicultural identify needs a coordinated external effort from the fragmented layers of governments to enhance the country's position in the international hierarchy and reap economic benefits.

 *2008 Beijing Olympics enhanced China's image as a modern economy and a harmless citizen of the world, and helped overseas Chinese identify itself with the country.*

Posing a threat

Canada currently ranks 13th on the Global Competitiveness Index. While it leads in health and primary education, it lacks innovation and business sophistication [World Economic Forum, 2015]. Hosting a mega-event could drive new innovative solutions and businesses.

 *The Eiffel Tower, which used engineering and construction innovations, was unveiled at the 1889 World Expo. Over 250 million people have visited it since its opening [Tour Eiffel, n.d.].*



Economic

Attracting new talent

From 2000 to 2010, Toronto's productivity declined by 6% [KPMG, 2014]. By showing that Canada is an attractive place to live and work, Toronto could seek talent globally.

 *In the last 12 months, over 49,000 LinkedIn members moved to the UAE, where Expo 2020 will be hosted. After winning Expo 2020, UAE's reputation as a country to work has improved [Emirates 247, 2014].*

Building up

A number of Toronto infrastructure and construction projects have fallen behind schedule, have gone over budget, or have not yet commenced. Mega-events provide a firm deadline and are often used to drive projects.

 *The 1992 Barcelona Olympics, led to major investments in new transport system, and the rejuvenation and urbanization of a run-down coastal area, which has a new marina, leisure facilities, and attractive sandy beaches.*



Environmental

Global sustainable initiatives

Canada is very focused on sustainability and environmental initiatives. By hosting a mega-event, Canada could be the center stage for new green initiatives.

 *The theme of the Specialized Expo 2012, held in Yeosu, Korea, was "The Living Ocean and Coast". The goal was to use technology to resolve challenges facing the ocean [Korea Times, 2010].*

Living in a green city

Toronto aspires to reduce its greenhouse gas emissions by 80% by 2050. The city is recognized internationally for its environmental leadership and initiatives, including the Sustainable Energy Strategy and the Climate Adaption Plan [City of Toronto, 2016].

 *The 2012 London Summer Olympics was declared the most sustainable yet. The stadium was built using recycled materials and 97% of construction waste was diverted from landfills [The Telegraph, 2012].*




Analysis of Past Mega-Events

LOCATING 26 YEARS OF MEGA-EVENTS



* Includes planned events as well (2016 to 2024)

The majority of past events are concentrated in Europe, the UK, and Asia. Since Canada has hosted mega-events less frequently and less recently, Toronto's bid may have an advantage over many other countries in the voting phase.

HOSTING TWO OR MORE MEGA-EVENTS WITHIN 10 YEARS



65% of mega-events were hosted by the same country within 10 years of another mega-event. Countries that did not host multiple mega-events were less developed and were smaller proponents in the international landscape.
